

Tri-Township Park District Troy, Illinois  
Sept. 25 1967

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-Township Park District was held on Monday Evening, Sept. 25 1967 in the City Council Room.

Commissioners present were Russell Wiesemeyer, Milton Langenwalter, George Schmalz and J. W. Dull.

Others present were attorney Wendell Durr, and Paul Ring of the Troy Tribune.

The meeting was called to order by President Russell Wiesemeyer at 7:40 P.M.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr Durr reported that a letter was sent to Mr. Hecht advising him to cease farming as of Jan. 1 1968.

Mr Durr advised President Russell Wiesemeyer to check with Mr. Teptmeier as to putting in a fall wheat crop for the District. All members of the board agreed that they would approve whatever negotiations seemed proper to Mr. Wiesemeyer.

Reports of Committees & officers: Mr Langenwalter reported that he had contacted the following Engineering firms: 1. Harland Bartholomew and Associates, 2. Mid-Western Parks and Recreational Planning Consultants. Mr Wiesemeyer reported that Mr. Bebee of the firm of H. W. Lochner had contacted us on Monday, Sept. 18, and will probably give us a bid on Engineering and survey work.

J. W. Dull reported on the progress of our Preliminary Planning Report to the Department of Business and Economic Development. It was moved by Milton Langenwalter, and seconded by George Schmalz, that Russell Wiesemeyer and J. W. Dull be empowered to edit and complete the final draft of this report. The motion carried as all voted aye. (without further review by the Board)

Claims and Accounts: none

Old Business: Russell Wiesemayer reported that Paul Rebold had stated that he had an opinion from an Attorney that the expense of the election to form a Park District should be paid by the County. Mr Wiesemayer will see that the bill is presented to the County.

Wendell Durr presented a petition for the annexation of the Park Property into the City limits. It was moved by J. W. Dull and seconded by George Schmalz that the Petition for annexing the Park property into the City limits, be approved. The motion carried as all voted aye.
