

Tri-Township Park District
August 28, 1972.

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Tri-Township Park District was held on Monday Evening, August 28, 1972 at Russ's Car Wash.

Commissioners present were: Russell Wiesemeyer, Oscar Sindler, George Schmalz, and J. W. Dull.

Others present were: Bill Rehling, President, Bob Parks, Terry Roderick, and Bob Huston, all of the J. C.'s.

The meeting was called to order by Pres. Russell Wiesemeyer at 7:45 P.M.

The J. C.'s present were then called upon. They discussed the dugouts that they have started to build and indicated that they had still received criticism of the concrete block construction, but that they wanted to complete those started.

They were assured that the Park Board had approved ^{the dugout construction} on June 26th. It was suggested that they complete the dugouts they have started and that if a change was desired, the dugouts could be revised later. The J. C.'s expect to build dugouts at the other two diamonds also. They then discussed the possibility of their building and operating a concession stand in the park. The advantages of an automobile trailer concession stand was discussed. It was moved by Oscar Sindler and seconded by George Schmalz that the J. C.'s be granted permission to pursue the idea of obtaining a portable concession stand to be used in the Park. The motion carried.

They then discussed the idea of them putting on a fire works display in the Park on the 4th of July. It was suggested that such a thing might get too big for the Park, especially without an entrance from Rt. 162. It was moved by George Schmalz and seconded by Oscar Sindler that we grant the J. C.'s permission

Milton Langerwalter reported that he had

 a soft Ball Diamond. He, Langerwalter, and
 Lindler, will stake out a soft ball diamond
 in the Park next Saturday.

The treasurer's report was read. It was
 moved by George Schmah, and seconded by Milton
 Langerwalter, that the report be accepted as
 read. The motion carried.

The tree fund was discussed. It was
 moved by J.W. Dull and seconded by Milton Langerwalter
 that the Bank be informed not to accept any
 more tree donations until further notice.
 The motion carried, but all other donations
 will be accepted.
