## MINUTES - TRI-TOWNSHIP PARK DISTRICT

The regular monthly meeting of the Tri-Township Park District Board of Commissioners was convened at the Pavillion meeting room on November 17, 1981 at 8:00 P.M. with president Russell Wiese Meyer presiding. In addition to the president, Commissioners Leonard and Foucek answered present to the roll call. Attorney Robert Cadigan was also present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was read and the bills were presented. Motion to accept Treasurer's report and pay the bills was made by Commissioner Foucek, seconded by Commissioner Leonard and carried. Payment of the Meyer Yardservice bill will be delayed subject to approval of work.

It was noted that the Soccer Club has agreed to reseed the area on the large ball diamond, which has been used for soccer games, at the points where the goals were set.

Motion was made by Commissioner Foucek, seconded by Commissioner Leonard and carried to make a contribution of \$50.00 to W.H. Carson to cover transportation expense of 30 55 gallon drums donated to the park by Mr. Carson.

Commissioner Leonard read a letter from the Department of Conservation on the approval of the Power Line Burial project. Requested completion of billing form provided was accomplished and returned on November 3, 1981. The 50% project reimbursement amount is expected within the next 60 days.

It was noted that the Soccer Club has requested permission to set posts around the new Soccer Area connected by cable and lay gravel on both sides of lake drive for parking. The laying of gravel was received favorably by the Board but the post and cable arrangement was vetoed due to safety precautions.

A Certificate of Appreciation was received from the Troy Soccer Club for the District's continuing support of that organization during 1981

Attorney Cadigan reported that the tax levy has been filed.
